New Years Wholesale Plant Sale!

Acer circinatum—2 gallon ~~\$6.50~~ **\$6.25** – Vine maples love partial to full shade and moist to dry soil. They provide colorful foliage, and their deep, spreading roots and layering branches control erosion.

Acer macrophyllum – 2 gallon ~~\$6.50~~ **\$5.50** – Large specimen trees, bigleaf maples have strong, spreading roots that excel at stabilizing marine bluffs. This species can tolerate full sun to shade and wet to dry soils.

Cornus sericea – 1 gallon ~~\$3.10~~ **\$2.50** – These red osier dogwoods are a steal! The stout, multi branched shrubs grown from Thurston County seed look fantastic. They tolerate wet soil and summer drought – perfect for rain gardens, or deciduous screening along a fence or property line.

Corylus cornuta – 2 gallon ~~\$7.95~~ **\$6.00** – Beaked hazelnuts are hardy, spreading shrubs that endure well drained moist to dry soil conditions. The roots bind and stabilize soil and the nuts are coveted by wildlife. This species usually sells out early each year.

Fraxinus latifolia – 2 gallon ~~\$6.50~~ **\$6.00** – Oregon ash is a robust, fast growing tree that prefers wet to saturated soil and tolerates occasional flooding. Often found growing in association with Oregon white oak.

Lonicera involucrata – 2 gallon ~~\$6.00~~ **\$5.25** – Give this native honeysuckle wet soil and it will grow several feet a year! Black twinberry survives drier sites as well, and bears lovely flowers and deep blue-black berries!

Mahonia aquifolium – 2 gallon ~~\$6.50~~ **\$5.50** – Tall Oregon grape makes a great evergreen screen, and loves windswept marine bluffs. It will survive rocky dry soil and open sun while still providing berries for the birds.

Pseudotsuga menziesii – 2 gallon ~~\$6.95~~ **\$6.00** – A drought tolerant evergreen tree, Douglas fir grows rapidly and endures full sun. It is excellent at anchoring slopes, and providing stability.

Rosa nutkana – 2 gallon ~~\$6.50~~ **\$6.00** – One of our restoration superstars, Nootka rose flourishes in a wide range of sun and moisture regimes, forms thickets rapidly, and even competes with Himalayan blackberry.

Rubus spectabilis – 2 gallon ~~\$6.50~~ **\$5.75** – Salmonberry performs great with plentiful moisture and shade, and once established, it grows vigorously and form thickets that create essential habitat. Salmonberry's vivid flowers develop into delicious berries that nourish a wide range of wildlife species.

Sambucus racemosa – 2 gallon ~~\$6.75~~ **\$6.00** – We love red elderberry! It provides flowers and berries for pollinators and wildlife. The fast growing red elderberry prefers well-drained moist soil and full sun to shade.

Symphoricarpos albus – 2 gallon ~~\$6.50~~ **\$6.00** – Snowberry is one of our all-time favorite plants. This low-growing shrub thrives in a huge range of site conditions, tolerates full sun and dry soil, spreads quickly, forms thickets, binds soil, and provides habitat and food year round.

Our mild winters create excellent conditions for establishing plants on a variety of restoration sites. So hurry up and take advantage of our sale, get those plants for your project now!
